PTA Policies and Procedures

Introduction

This policy and procedure has been compiled by the PTA for its members, active members of the committee and Trustees. It gives more in-depth explanation about the PTA, safety and procedural policies which are required for Charity organizations.

Message from the Governing Body

The PTA is an essential part of our college. All parents and careers are members and everyone's contribution is highly valued. The work of the PTA underpins the whole college. Financial support enables us to create a richer learning environment for our students.

Role of the Committee

Our PTA committee consists of three Officers: Chair or Co-Chairs, Treasurer and Secretary all of whom are trustees as well as three other members. We currently have co-chairs. This is a minimum requirement for a charity however there are active PTA members who form a dedicated team to lead events. The Committee meet on a regular basis usually once per term, with smaller working groups meeting as necessary when we are planning larger events.

A committee formed every year committee empowered to give benefit to the students out of PTA funds The followings point was considered for PTA benefit. Role of the PTA (Parent-Teacher Association) committee in providing benefits to students using PTA funds, particularly in situations involving students who are siblings, fatherless, or come from poor families with no income source.

- 1. Siblings:** The PTA committee might consider providing benefits to poor students if they have siblings attending the college. This could be in recognition of the additional support and involvement the teacher provides to the school community by educating multiple students from the same family.
- 2. Fatherless Students:** In cases where students are fatherless, the committee might decide to provide benefits to students as a gesture of support for their efforts in providing guidance and care to these students who may lack paternal support at home.
- 3. Poor Families with No Income Source:** The committee may extend benefits to students who are from poor families with no income source. This could be to recognize the extra effort and dedication required to support these students who may face additional challenges due to their socioeconomic circumstances. By providing benefits to students in these situations, the PTA demonstrates appreciation for their commitment to providing quality education and support to all students, regardless of their background.

In each of these scenarios, the PTA committee acts as a decision-making body responsible for allocating funds in a way that supports the college community and recognizes the contributions of teachers who go above and beyond in their roles.
